

DO NOT BRING TO CAMP

- Too many clothes (you are only at camp three or five days!)
- Large amounts of money, expensive jewelry or other valuable items
- Television, radio, knives, bicycle, pets, fireworks, archery gear, electronic games or headsets
- Coolers

How Much Money Is Needed At Camp?

Money will be needed for items such as: snacks and soft drinks; Crafts (vary from \$.30 to \$6.00); Camp T-shirts and other souvenirs.

Good rule of thumb - Most youth bring between \$15 - 20 to camp. Campers will want to deposit their money in our central bank from which they can make withdrawals at specific times.

MEDICAL INFORMATION

If your child takes any kind of medication, it **MUST** be checked in upon arrival at camp. All medications must be brought in their original container and prescriptions must have the child's name on the container. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to discuss the child's needs with the Health and Safety Director. If you are not accompanying your child to camp, we would request that you write a note concerning the child's medication. The camp will then see that the medication is administered correctly.

Any camper needing injections (insulin, allergy, etc.) will be transported to Kirby Hospital in Monticello or to a Monticello physician for this medicine. Persons needing injections must bring written authorization from their own physician for this treatment. There will be a charge for injections given in the office of a physician or at the hospital.

Accident/Illness Insurance: 4-H Memorial Camp will carry accident/illness insurance on camp participant to the level of \$3,000 per accident and \$1,000 per illness. Camper sickness and/or injury sustained while at camp must be reported and recorded while on site to be covered. Pre-existing illness such as asthma and diabetes are not covered.

Archery Program: Instruction will be conducted according to National 4-H Shooting Sports and American Camping Association Accreditation standards and guidelines under the direct supervision of the Camp Director. All equipment used will be owned by 4-H Memorial Camp and be maintained and secured appropriately on-site. All range rules will be covered during program orientation and direct control of all participants will be monitored at all times by camp personnel. As with every 4-H Camp activity, participation is voluntary.

Behavior/Discipline: Camper conduct at all times shall be appropriate to the standards and image of the 4-H program. Participants must abide by the rules and regulations of 4-H Memorial Camp, Extension staff, and official volunteers. These rules will be clearly explained on the first day of camp. Failure to obey these rules may result in dismissal from camp in extreme situations. A parent/guardian will be notified immediately if a camper becomes disruptive to the camp program.

New for 2009- Cell Phone Policy: Parents are highly encouraged **NOT** to let their children bring a cell phone to camp. Please understand the camp staff will call you if there is ever need to do so with any serious situation relating to your child's health or well being. However, if you insist your child possess a cell phone, please be advised the phone will be turned off and placed in the possession of the camp manager. The camper may only use the cell phone for emergency purposes. To insure the camp is a safe, controlled, environment, phones will not be allowed for social contact reasons or to take/send pictures. Parents are also urged **NOT** to call their campers with non-emergency topics during the camp week. For emergencies, call the camp at the land line numbers listed above. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

Refund Policy: 75% of fee will be refundable if cancellation is 7 days or more prior to the first day of the camping session. No refund when cancellation is 6 days or less prior to the first day of the camping session.
