Manure Management Training for Illinois Livestock Producers



2009-2010 Certified Livestock Manager Training Workshops

The Illinois Livestock Management Facilities Act of 1997 requires livestock producer training through the Certified Livestock Manager Training program (see www.livestocktraining.com and www.EZregs.uiuc.edu for details). Some of the new training workshop topics include:

- Winter spreading of manure - planning for extreme conditions
- Manure on forage crops; feed storage runoff solutions
- Operating safely around manure storages
- Foaming liquid manure storages - why now, what to do?
- Innovative technologies for manure processing and odor/gas emission controls
- LMFA and related regulations

The training manual, in use since 2003, is the national Livestock and Poultry Environmental Stewardship (LPES) Curriculum. These manuals are available and are strongly recommended for those new to the CLM program. **On-line quiz questions and state exam questions come from the LPES manual.** Workshops designated as **beef/dairy** or **swine** emphasis will concentrate on those production facilities. Pick the meeting that fits your schedule and interests. Plan to attend the CLM training workshop in your area and renew your state CLM certificate.

Options for Illinois Livestock Producers

In Illinois, livestock facilities with more than 300 animal units must have someone certified in manure handling procedures. To become certified, producers with 300 - 999 animal units can either attend a University of Illinois Extension C.L.M.T. workshop or take and pass the Illinois Department of Agriculture administered Certified Livestock Manager exam. Producers with over 1,000 animal units are required to do both.

University of Illinois Extension also offers a series of five quizzes on the internet. Passing all five quizzes is the equivalent of having attended the C.L.M.T morning workshop for becoming a Certified Livestock Manager.

C.L.M.T. Quiz Registration Information

There is no cost for the on-line quiz option. The only cost is for the C.L.M.T. manual. To sign up:
