2009 IL Livestock Premises Registration Requirement

A Livestock Premises Identification Number will be required for exhibition at all 2009 county, state, 4-H and FFA fairs in Illinois. This applies to all livestock, fowl, horses and poultry—including beef, sheep, swine, dairy, goats, poultry, rabbits, horses, and exotic hoof stock (i.e. llamas).

Livestock Premises Identification/Registration is part of the National Animal Identification System (NAIS), which is a state/federal/industry cooperative program intended to identify animal premises by assigning a unique number (a Premises Identification Number) to each location where livestock and/or poultry are born, managed, marketed or exhibited. Premises registration is critical to protecting Illinois' livestock industry as it helps animal health officials minimize trace back times in the event of an animal disease outbreak.

- A Premises ID is for the location where animals are produced and/or raised.
- The Premises ID number may or may not be registered in the exhibitor's name as it relates only to location and not ownership.
- 4-H members must have parent/guardian consent before applying for a Premises ID number.
- The Premises ID number should be obtained prior to making fair entries and should be placed on the entry form.

Premises registration is free and can be performed online at www.agr.state.il.us/premiseid or by calling 866-299-9256 for a paper form. When registering online, you will be immediately issued the Premises ID number. When mailing in a paper form, you may need to allow 3-4 weeks to be issued a number. Action-Oriented Day and County Fair 2009

Hopefully all 4-H families are aware of the changes made regarding the 2008 Action-Oriented Day. This event will be held on Wednesday, July 15, 2009 at the DuPage County Extension Office, located in Naperville. The following projects will be judged during the Action-Oriented event on Wednesday, July 15, 2009: Bicycles, Food Demonstrations, and Public Speaking.

The following projects will be exhibited and judged at the DuPage County Fair on Monday, July 20, 2009 through Wednesday July 22, 2009: Aerospace, Camping, Cats, Child Care, Citizenship, Clothing & Textiles, Communications, Computers, Consumer Ed., Crops and Soils, Electricity, Entomology, Food and Nutrition, Forestry, Geology, Geospatial, Health, Horticulture, Floriculture, Passport to the World, Walk in my Shoes, Interior Design, Leadership, Natural Resources, Theater Arts, Reading, Photography, Plant & Soil Science, Robotics, Small Engines, Small Pets, Tractor, Ani-

mal Science, Visual Arts, Woodworking, and Collections.

Collections is a non-premium opportunity. 4-H'ers may exhibit a collection and conference judge; however, only a participation ribbon will be awarded. Your club leader will have a sign-up sheet. Collection exhibits are not required to remain on display throughout County Fair week. 4-H'ers may take their exhibit home upon completion of judging in this project only.

County Fair livestock judging will take place Wednesday, July 22, 2009 through Friday, July 24, 2009. Livestock projects include: Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, and Swine.

The project enrollment deadline for Action-Oriented Day and County Fair is 4:00 pm Thursday, April 9, 2009. All Action-Oriented and County Fair registrations must be to the Extension office by 4:00 pm Thursday, June 11, 2009. Late registrations will not be accepted.

All General 4-H Eligibility Rules, project descriptions, and exhibit requirements for Action-Oriented projects and County Fair projects will be in the 4-H Division section of the DuPage County Fairbook. A copy of the 2009 4-H section of the DuPage County Fairbook is posted on the web at:

Youth must participate in a minimum of four 4-H meetings, tours, workshops, and/or other 4-H activities to be considered a 4-H member in DuPage County. Those who do not meet this requirement will not be eligible to take part in 4-H exhibitions, receive 4-H premiums, or other 4-H awards and recognition that are available to 4-H members. With your fair registration paperwork, you will receive a form that asks you to indicate your 4-H activities. This form must be completed and returned with your registration.

2009 Fashion Revue

If you would like to participate in the 4-H Fashion Revue at the 2009 DuPage County Fair, you don't have to be enrolled in Sewing and Textiles. Those of you who plan to exhibit a knitted garment in either the Visual Arts, Heritage Arts class or the Visual Arts, Fiber class also have an opportunity to participate in the Revue. When filling out your registration form (due June 11, 2009 by 4:00 p.m.), mark that you would like to participate in the Fashion Revue. You must pre-register to participate in the Fashion Revue!

Horse Ownership Paperwork Due May 1

4-H'ers interested in exhibiting at either the DuPage County Horse Show or the Illinois State Horse Show must turn in ownership or lease papers for all animals (horses and ponies) the member may exhibit. *Ownership papers are used for horses or ponies that are owned by the youth (not the parent) and lease papers are used if the youth is leasing the horse from someone, including a relative.*

A high quality photo of each side of each animal must be submitted with the ownership/lease paperwork. Pictures are mandatory for all horse and ponies, grade, and registered animals. Please do not submit photocopies of photos. Photos must be originals and must be submitted by the deadline.

If you plan to participate in the county 4-H Horse Show and the Illinois State Fair Junior Horse Show, you must submit two sets of paperwork and two sets of photographs.

PLEASE NOTE: Substitution of horses cannot be made after the May 1 deadline. Therefore, it is strongly recommended that you submit papers and photos on all horses or ponies you might show. This way if the horse of preference is unavailable, you still have an option.

Horse Clinic and Horse Show Deadlines

Anyone enrolled in the horse project may participate in the Horse Clinic on June 13-14 at the DuPage County Fairgrounds. There is a fee for the horse clinic. Details are included in the registration packet. Registration is required and will be due by 4:00 pm on May 1. Clinic registration forms can be obtained from your 4-H leader, at www.extension.uiuc.edu/dupage, or by calling the Extension office.

Registration to participate in the DuPage 4-H Horse Show to be held June 27 is also due by 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 28. Registration paperwork will be sent directly to anyone who turns in horse ownership/lease paperwork by May 1. If you don't get paperwork, and you turned in paperwork online, you must call the Extension office. No late registrations will be accepted for either event.

All participants will be required to wear a helmet during any mounted activity. This is in accordance with the state rules, and will be enforced.

Proof of Negative Coggins at Events

A current proof of a negative Coggins test will be required and checked upon arrival at the horse clinic and horse show. Horses may not be removed from their trailer until they have been checked. Anyone without proof of a negative Coggins test will be asked to leave. There will be **no** exceptions. Coggins paperwork should not be submitted with Horse Ownership/Lease paperwork. Illinois law requires that proof of negative Coggins accompany any horse participating in an advertised event. The Extension office is not responsible for providing this paperwork on the day of any event. The requirements for Illinois Equine are as follows:

"Illinois Equine (horses, ponies, mules, etc.) – (Exhibition or Race) 12 months and older participating in an advertised equine event ("Advertised equine event" means a show, rodeo, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair, excluding sales or auction, that is posted or media promoted) shall be accompanied by a negative test or Equine Infectious Anemia/E.I.A. (Coggins/ Celisa) conducted within one (1) year. A health certificate is not required for Illinois Equine."

Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification Training:

Required for New Animal Project Members

If you plan to exhibit livestock at the DuPage County Fair or State Fair, you must complete the Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification Training. If you have completed this training in the past and are on the approved list, you will not need to re-certify.

All State Fair beef, sheep, swine, horse, dairy, and meat goat exhibitors are required to complete QA&E Certification via this site. New this year is poultry. Poultry is a required species for the QAEC. Certification need only be done once. Certification can be completed at your convenience. However, it must be completed by the following deadlines: June 9 for horse exhibitors; July 1 for beef, dairy, goats, sheep, swine and POULTRY. The site is currently open! DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE. The site will be closed after July 1 and no other options will be available.

Please remember: If you plan to show beef, sheep, swine, dairy, goats, poultry, rabbits, or horses—you are required to have a premise ID. Premises registration is free and can be performed online at www.agr.state.il.us/premiseid or by calling 866/299-9256 for a paper form. Please contact Christine Birns at the Extension office with questions.

Building (#2) during the Fair. Entries will be judged based on the most creative use of recycled material, craftsmanship and technique. Premiums and rosettes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in the amounts of \$50, \$25, and \$10 respectively. All entries will receive a special Participation Ribbon.

County 4-H Policies Reminder

In an effort to support a quality 4-H experience in DuPage County, there are revised 4-H policies that are in effect immediately for 4-H members, clubs, volunteers, and independent members. These policies were established so that those involved in 4-H in this county will know that there are expectations regarding participation.

Members

Goal: To encourage a well-rounded 4-H experience.

Policy: Youth must participate in a minimum of four 4-H meetings, tours, workshops, and/or other 4-H activities in DuPage County (or representing DuPage County) to be considered a 4-H member in DuPage County. Those who do not meet this requirement will not be eligible to take part in 4-H exhibitions, receive 4-H premiums or other 4-H awards and recognition that are available to 4-H members.

Goal: To encourage 4-H'ers to participate in the County Fair.
Policy: Only 4-H'ers who are exhibiting at the Action-Oriented Day (a week before the Fair) or County Fair (which includes Action-Oriented Day) will receive an armband for free admission into the fair.

Clubs

Goal: To encourage a well-rounded 4-H experience.

Policy: All clubs will submit the Club Program Plan Form by

December 1 of each program year. Clubs are encouraged to use the Club Standards of Excellence as a guideline for establishing their annual plan.

Goal: To encourage a well-rounded 4-H experience.

Policy: All clubs will keep a secretary book with attendance records for all club meetings and activities. All clubs must submit their secretary book at the end of the 4-H year to the DuPage Extension Office.

Policy: Any club that maintains a treasury is required to keep a treasury record and supporting documentation which must be submitted to the DuPage Extension Office at the end of the 4-H year (August 31 of each year).

Goal: To facilitate good fiscal management of 4-H funds and adherence to 4-H policy.

Policy: Any club participating in a fundraising event must seek prior approval by completing and submitting the Fundraising Approval Form to the Extension Office. Approval may take up to two weeks.

Policy: Any club participating in a fundraising event will complete and submit the Fundraising Income & Expense Statement Template within two weeks following the approved fundraising activity.

Volunteers

Goal: To assure that all volunteers are acknowledged for their contributions to 4-H.

Policy: County fair armbands will be given to any 4-H volunteer who is officially enrolled as a 4-H volunteer and who has contributed 25 or more hours of service during the current 4-H year. This policy applies to club volunteers, committee members, and others fulfilling a DuPage county volunteer role.

Goal: To enhance communication and the volunteer experience.

Policy: Every club will send a representative to each leader meeting. This may be a volunteer or parent from the club.

Enrollment means you are signing up to be in 4-H. When you enroll, you also complete a Project Selection Form to enroll in 4-H projects. Enrollment due by 4:00 pm on April 9 for Action-Oriented/County Fair projects.

Registration means you are indicating you want to take part in a specific 4-H event, e.g. the County Fair. Registration due by 4:00 pm on June 11 for Action-Oriented County Fair 4-H projects.
