

## **INTERCULTURAL DIVISION**

### **Intercultural Rules and Regulations**

1. In order to exhibit in the Intercultural division, the 4-H member must be enrolled in:  
**Passport to the World – 4-H Passport to the World: A Country Study Guide**
2. This may be done as an individual project or group project.
3. See General Projects Guidelines
4. All items (including project book) must be attached to display board. No additional items should be included. (If it cannot be mounted to the display board- DO NOT bring it.)
5. Each county may submit entries for state fair competition.

### **Class 01 – Passport to the World – Individual**

Prepare a display in one of the subclass areas below. Exhibitor should be prepared to answer questions from judges on *ANY* of the categories. Project manuals must accompany displays.

#### **Subclass A – Geography**

Display should include something on the geography, economy and/or agriculture of a particular country or region of the United States chosen to study.

#### **Subclass B – People**

Display should include facts learned about the racial-ethnic groupings, population, languages, religions and/or housing of country or region of the United States chosen to study.

#### **Subclass C – Culture**

Display might include music, crafts, clothing, housing, holiday celebrations, etc. from the country or region of the United States chosen to study.

### **Class 02 – Passport to the World – Club**

Display criteria same as individual projects. All club members present for the judge's critique should be able to discuss the project. These members must not be exhibiting in the individual project area.
