

BICYCLE DIVISION

Bicycle Rules and Regulations:

1. In order to exhibit in the bicycle division, the 4-H member must be enrolled in:
Bicycle Adventures I – *Bicycle Adventures I* Pub. BU-7503 OR
Bicycle Adventures II - *Bicycle Adventures II* Pub. BU-7504 OR
Bicycle Adventures III – *Bicycle Adventures III* Pub. BU-7505
2. See General Project Guidelines
3. Exhibitors MUST bring their own bicycle.
4. Approved safety helmets are strongly encouraged for all exhibitors.
5. Exhibitors are not allowed to ride their bicycles outside of the approved exhibit area.
6. County may submit four entries to State Fair in Class II and III only.

Class 01 - BICYCLE I - Exhibitor may complete the Bicycle Safety Demonstration Course **OR** display a poster.

Class 02 - BICYCLE II - Exhibitor will complete the Bicycle Safety Demonstration Course **and** complete a poster display **and** exhibitor will be asked to demonstrate two bicycle adjustments: 1) Air the tires to the proper pressure, AND 2) One item as drawn by exhibitor for the judge. The list of items included in the “draw bag” will be from the following list: Adjust the helmet, seat, handle bars, lever angles, or shock absorbers OR oil the chain or levers, OR remove & replace the front wheel. Exhibitor must furnish any tools necessary for these procedures.

Class 03 – BICYCLE III – Exhibitor will complete the Bicycle Safety Demonstration Course **and** complete a poster display **and** exhibitor will be asked to demonstrate two maintenance practices: 1) Change a tire on a rim (that will be provided), AND 2) One item drawn by exhibitor for the judge. The list of items included in the “draw bag” will be from the following list: Adjust the brake shoes, cable tension, de railer, or head set OR remove & replace the rear wheel OR true a wheel. Exhibitor must furnish any tools necessary for these procedures.

The safety demonstration may consist of any or all of the following:

1. Written test on proper maintenance, adjustment, operation, and safety laws/rules regarding bicycles.
2. Inspection of exhibitor's bicycle, including brakes, height, safety equipment, etc.
3. Riding "test" through a safety course, observing and following all rules and regulations.
