

GOAT DIVISION

Goat Rules and Regulations

1. In order to exhibit in the goat division, the 4-H member must be enrolled in:
Goat I - *Getting Your Goat* Pub. BU-6162 or
Goat II - *Stepping Out* Pub. BU-6163 or
Goat III - *Showing the Way* Pub. BU 6164
2. Refer to General Livestock Rules.
3. Ownership of Kids, Yearlings (not in milk) by June 1, current year. Ownership of Does (in milk), 1 year old and older by January 1, current year.
4. Entrants are limited to 2 entries per class.
5. Age of Goat for class determination is made day of show.
6. The use of muzzles is prohibited. All animals must be fed and watered while on exhibit.

DAIRY GOAT SHOW

Class 01 - Doe Kid - under 5 months of age

Class 02 - Doe Kid - 5 to 12 months of age

Class 03 - Yearling - not in milk

Class 04 - Milking Doe - 12 to 23 months of age

Class 05 - Milking Doe - 24 to 47 months of age

Class 06 - Milking Doe - 48 months and over of age

PYGMY/SPECIALTY GOAT SHOW

Class 07 – Junior Doe - 12 months and under

Class 08- Senior Doe- Over 12 months

MEAT GOAT SHOW

Class 09 – Doe Kid - under 5 months of age

Class 10 - Doe Kid - 5 to 12 months of age

Class 11 – Junior Yearling – 12 to 23 months- not kidded

GOAT DIVISION (CONT.)

Class 12 - Senior Doe - 12 to 23 months of age

Class 13 - Senior Doe - 24 to 47 months of age

Class 14 - Senior Doe - 48 months and over of age

MARKET GOAT SHOW

1. Wethers or does may exhibit --no bucks allowed in Market Class
2. Animals shown in Market Goat class may not show in breeding classes
3. Must be kidded on or after October 1, previous year
4. Goats may show with or without horns.
5. Dairy breeds, Pygmy/Specialty breeds and Meat breeds, as well as wethers and does, may be shown separately depending on numbers of actual entries. Superintendents and staff will make such determination at fair weigh-in.

Class 16- Pair of Market Goats

SHOWMANSHIP Exhibitor age is determined by 4-H age which is the age of the member on September 1, previous year. 4-H Members must be entered in the showmanship class on their fair registration forms and exhibit their own animal (breeding or market) in order to compete. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Class 17- Junior Showmanship - 8 to 10 years of age

Class 18- Intermediate Showmanship – 11-13 years of age

Class 19 - Senior Showmanship - 14 to 18 years of age

ANIMAL SCIENCE DISPLAY

Class 20 - Goat Animal Science Display - Suggested topics could include-Breeds of goats, Growth process of goats, Goat herd health maintenance calendar
