

CLOTHING & TEXTILES - JUDGING SCHEDULE - Saturday, June 20, Judging and Fashion Revue (style show) will be held at the fairgrounds in the Merchant Building. The exhibitor must be present during judging. Bring clothing item on hanger to be judged for construction first. Exhibitors bringing garments should plan to wear the garment as part of the judging process. **If the garment(s) were constructed for another individual, that individual must be present to wear the garment for the judge. (Only the exhibitor who made the garment is eligible for ribbon and premium.) Construction and appearance will both be considered.** If a pattern was used to make the garment, the pattern instructions are to be included with the exhibit. **Garment/items will not be placed on display unless covered in a clear plastic bag (no garment bags). Exhibit tags should be attached to garment, not hanger.** There will be a place to hang your garments until 11:00 a.m. when you will prepare for the style show. Tote bags, general sewing, and pillow projects should be taken to the 4-H Building immediately following judging. The Style Show will be held on the fairgrounds at approximately 11:15 a.m., Saturday, June 20. During the style show, the garment will be judged on fit and appearance.

DEPARTMENT RULES:

SPECIAL NOTE: Knitted items should be exhibited under Visual Arts – Fiber (if original) or Visual Arts – Heritage Arts (if made from a pattern).

1. No parents, friends, or spectators will be allowed during conference judging.
2. All Clothing projects are to be taken to the 4-H General Projects Bldg. following the Clothing Revue (non-clothing items may be taken to the General Projects Bldg. following judging) for display during the fair. **YOU MUST PICK THEM UP BETWEEN 12:00 noon to 1:15 p.m.** on Sunday, June 28.
3. Please cover garment with clear plastic cleaner's bag (**no garment bags**).
4. The **Fashion Revue** will be held at approximately 11:15 a.m. Saturday, June 20 on the fairgrounds. **Modeled items must be garments constructed or purchased by the exhibitor.**
5. All Fashion Revue participants should fill out a clothing description sheet that will be available at the front table on General Projects day. Please bring the completed sheet with you to the clothing judging. These sheets will be used in the style revue.
6. The **Fashion Revue** will be under the direction of the superintendents who will be assisted by older 4-H members. All exhibitors that have constructed or purchased a garment are expected to participate in this event.
7. Judging for State Fair Fashion Revue participants will take place during the Fashion Revue. Individuals selected for State Fair Fashion Revue will be responsible for writing their narration; the narration must be prepared prior to State Fair and mailed to the State 4-H Office by August 1, 2009 or emailed to Madonna Weese prior to the county judging day (mweese@uiuc.edu). **(NOTE: Knitted exhibits fall under Visual arts, however, knitted garments may still be considered for Fashion Revue).**
8. All projects will be left for the 4-H General Project Building display and **must be picked up Sunday, June 28, from 12:00 noon to 1:15 p.m.**
9. * Indicates that this project is eligible for state fair, if exhibitor meets age requirements.

Choose one of the items listed in the project you are enrolled in to exhibit.

* **Sewing & Textiles I (sew/serge)** – One tote bag using directions provided by Extension Office –or- shopping bag –or- constructed 9 Patch Pillow –or- square pillow –or- Constructed garment - A simple article of clothing.

* **Sewing & Textiles II (sew/serge)** – Non clothing – Any non-wearable item made by member –or- Constructed garment – Any garment with facings or curves

* **Sewing & Textiles III (sew/serge)** – Construction – Garment constructed by member, which is appropriate for age and experience of member. (Possible examples: wool garment, polar fleece garment, dress or jacket with set in sleeves and zipper or buttons and button holes, suits, evening wear or sport outfit) –or- Restyled Garment – A modified/redesigned/recycled garment you purchased in the past and “salvaged” by significantly altering the original design. A 3” X 5” minimum size photo of the original garment (before recycling) should be included.

* **Clothing Decisions I** – Exhibit a display of one completed activity from the project book. Inclusion of an actual purchased item is optional.

* **Clothing Decisions II** – Exhibit a display of one completed activity from the project book. Inclusion of an actual purchased item is optional.

* **CLOVER CHALLENGE: Clothing & Textiles** – Exhibit a display illustrating the Clover Challenge area explored. See General Rule #17 regarding Clover Challenge requirements. **The completed Illinois 4-H Clover Challenge Agreement must be presented with the exhibit.**
