Local government affects our daily life profoundly. *Tomorrow's Leaders: Understanding Illinois Local Government* is a high school curriculum that helps students understand how local government works for them. This curriculum contains eight units discussing issues such as: who's in local government, local government finance, physical infrastructure, law enforcement, the court system, local government services, public safety, and being a good citizen.

In order to participate in community decision-making, we need to know how local governments operate-and what services each kind of government provides for us.
