

Unplanted Bulbs

If you didn't get your spring-flowering bulbs planted, you are not alone. It is not uncommon to order bulbs and have them end up forgotten in a corner. The weather may have delayed planting and the bulbs are forgotten until discovered in January or February.

If the bulbs are discovered in late February, there may be enough time to meet the cooling requirements for these bulbs.

What should a homeowner do in this situation? Go ahead and plant the bulbs as soon as the soil permits. If there is not enough time to meet the chilling requirements, the bulbs will produce foliage, but will not bloom in the spring. The bulbs should bloom like normal the next spring.
