The McLean County Fair Horse Show is not a member of USEF (formerly USAE) or AQHA; however, this show will use these organizations' rulebooks as guidelines.

Horses will be categorized as stock and non-stock. Horses do not need to be registered to qualify as stock or non-stock. Stock horses are Quarter, Paint, or Appaloosa-type animals. Non-stock horses are Thoroughbred, Arabian, Morgan, Saddlebred, Tennessee Walkers, Warmbloods, gaited horses, and draft horses.

The Horse Director (after consultation with the county veterinarian), may excuse animals from the fairgrounds if their appearance (overall health and body condition) is not appropriate for exhibition. If, after veterinarian examination it is determined that it is in the animal's best interest to not be exhibited (prior to or during the fair), the Horse Director MAY allow the horse to be released or replaced. In addition, training methods and devices which could be considered inhumane, should not be used during the fair.

Rules:

- A. All animals must be in exhibitor's care and **meet all requirements of annual enrollment by May 1, 2009. County Lease and Ownership forms need to be on file at the County Extension Office by May 1, 2009.**
- B. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry in each eligible class, and one halter class per animal.
- C. **Exhibitors who are Walk/Trot or Novice in ALL divisions may only exhibit one animal.** Exhibitors who have attained Horsemaster or Horseman in any division may exhibit two animals. (Example: An exhibitor is a Novice in Hunt Seat and Horseman in Western. That exhibitor is allowed to exhibit two animals.)
- D. **REVISED RULE -SHARING A HORSE:** Two "non-related" exhibitors can share a horse. More than two can share a horse **ONLY** if they are siblings. If siblings share a horse, it cannot be shared with other exhibitors. Complete ONE ownership/lease form per shared animal including all exhibitor's names. Forms are due by May 1. Animals can only be entered once per class (ie, both exhibitors cannot show the same animal in the same class). If both exhibitors who are sharing an animal advance to the Championship class, only one will be allowed to participate in that class. If a decision cannot be made between the exhibitors, then the eldest exhibitor will take precedence and participate in the Championship class.
- E. All animals must be stalled individually. (Exception: Miniatures under 38" may be stalled together.)
- F. Assigned/reserved stalls are for horse use only. If a horse is scratched from the fair, that reserved stall space will be reassigned by the Horse Director at the end of horse check in. Do not place any tack, bedding, or hay in stalls which are unlabeled or assigned to horses which are not brought to the fair.
- G. Exhibitors must have current **original or photocopy** of negative Coggin's Test for each animal at check-in and should be kept by the exhibitor at the fairgrounds during the entire fair.
- H. Each horse, pony, mule, or donkey becomes one year older on January 1, regardless of its natural birthdate.
- I. **No foals or stallions** of any age will be allowed on the grounds.

- J. No dogs allowed in barns or near arenas. (Exception: For horse exhibitors who are also exhibiting dogs - on dog show day, dogs may be kept in a kennel in the tack stall.)
- K. Ponies are categorized as follows: English – 58" and under; Western – 56" and under. (Ponies are NOT young horses.) Ponies will be measured at check-in. Ponies 3 years old and under will be measured each year.
- L. Donkeys and mules may be shown in pony or horse classes as qualified.
- M. Exhibitor must **lead** horse from barn to designated mounting area. Signs will be posted.
- N. The following divisions are offered: English/Dressage, Western, Showmanship, Trail, and Jumping. The following exhibitor levels are used in each division:
 - 1) Walk-Trot (two year maximum; not used in Showmanship division)
 - 2) Novice (three year maximum; has not won two first placings at this level)
 - 3) Horseman (has not won two first placings at this level)
 - 4) Horsemaster (experienced showman)
- O. Horseman/Horsemaster jumping is limited to ONE Hunter Over Fences class and ONE Equitation Over Fences class.
- P. Exhibitors may show at different levels in each of the five divisions (English/Dressage, Western, Showmanship, Trail, and Jumping), and may also show at different levels within a division (i.e., an exhibitor may be a Horsemaster in Hunter under saddle, a Novice in Western Showmanship, and a Horseman in Western under saddle). Horsemaster/Horseman in jump classes may not show Novice in English flat classes.
- Q. An exhibitor may show in a Western **OR** English Showmanship class, **but not in both**.
- R. Exhibitor may show at the Walk-Trot level for two years only and may not enter any other class or game requiring lope, canter, or gait.
- S. Walk-Trot and Novice exhibitors may elect to show holding the reins with two hands, regardless of the age of the horse, provided a legal snaffle bit is used.
- T. SEI-ASTM labeled approved helmet (inspected at check-in) with harness affixed, will be required for all riders 21 years of age and under. Boots with heels, and long pants/breeches, will be required for all exhibitors while mounted or driving at any time during the fair. However, helmets are strongly encouraged for all riders. (EXCEPTION: If the horse is being led during costume class, this rule will not apply.)
- U. Each horse may only be ridden, driven, or worked by that horse's exhibitor, that exhibitor's immediate family, or that exhibitor's adult (over 18 yrs.) instructor.
- V. Jump vests are acceptable during any jumping classes.
- W. Each 4-H exhibitor is responsible for keeping his/her area by their stall neat and clean. (This includes wash rack after use.)
- X. Classes may be combined, or deleted at Horse Director's discretion.
- Y. No off-rack bathing of animals. Animals must be bathed in designated wash area only. (Again, please keep the wash rack area clean!)
- Z. Judges will be instructed to excuse any exhibitor he/she deems unsafe.

- AA. All decisions of the judges are final.
- BB. Good sportsmanship is a must. Any exhibitors or family members exhibiting unsportsman-like behavior may be excused from the horse show.
- CC. Exhibitors are to adhere to “safety instructions” from the Director or Superintendents, whether or not instructions are covered by a rule in the Fair Book.
- DD. Horses must be put in assigned stalls unless changes approved by Horse Director.
- EE. Only youth exhibitors may ride horses while show is in session. This means any adult may not ride during those times.
- FF. No bareback or riding double allowed at any time during the fair.
