Premiums: Classes 2621-2623 A-\$5 B-\$4 C-\$3*Failure to meet requirements will result in lowering of placing by one grade.***Design Decisions, Beginning:**

2621. Enter one of the following. Include a 3x5 card explaining what you did.

1. Wall Treatment—Poster showing the application of a decorative treatment for a wall (stenciling, rag rolling, etc.) used by exhibitor. Treatment should cover approximately ½ of the board. Remaining area of the board should include before/after photos, a picture story of the application, cost comparison, etc. **OR**
2. Three-dimensional surface accessory that will sit on a table, dresser, or floor. Item must be made by the exhibitor. Include photo of the item as used in the room. **OR**
3. An item that has been recycled (significantly altered) by the member. Include photo of the item as used in the room. **OR**
4. Wall hanging (two or three-dimensional), made by exhibitor. Include photo of the item as used in the room.

Design Decisions, Intermediate:

2622. Enter one of the following. Include a 3x5 card explaining what you did.

1. Comparison shopping study of at least two items showing wants and needs, costs, use in overall design plan, quality comparison, etc. and final selection made. May be displayed via poster or notebook. **OR**
2. Bedcover—May include a quilt, comforter, bedspread, dust ruffle, pillow sham, canopy, etc. made by exhibitor. Include photo of the item as used in the room. **OR**
3. Window Treatment—May include curtains, draperies, shades, shutters, etc. made by exhibitor. Include photo of the item as used in the room.

Design Decisions, Advanced:

2623. Enter one of the following. Include a 3x5 card explaining what you did.

1. Select one problem such as storage, unusual or odd-sized window, need for better lighting, privacy or an invention or idea that solves an energy or water problem. Show the steps used to solve the problem and the final product. Use pictures, samples, drawings, etc. to tell the story. Display in a notebook or on poster board. If an item was made by the exhibitor to solve the problem, include that item in the display. Include before and after photos in display. Displays illustrating a general “redecorating” of a room are not appropriate for this exhibit. **OR**
2. Exhibit one item of refinished furniture. Include a color photograph showing item in place in a room setting. Photo should be mounted. Include a description of the steps taken to refinish the item.

Rules:

1. *Failure to meet requirements will result in lowering of placing by one grade.*
2. Member will be present for judging and **should** bring pattern and instructions and all accessories worn with garment. Garments will be judged on the hanger first, then on the exhibitor with all accessories.
3. If exhibitor cannot be present for judging, three full-length photos showing all sides of garment on the 4-Her must be placed in an envelope and attached to the garment, (except in Clothing Decisions classes when garment(s) and all accessories will be judged ON exhibitor).
4. An exhibitor may only enter **one class** in **each subheading** of clothing (Sewing Divisions, Sewing With Knits, Non-Clothing, Recycled Garment, Clothing Posters, and Clothing Decisions). Individual classes may be repeated any number of years.
5. It is recommended that exhibitors complete sewing divisions in sequence, as each division introduces different sewing techniques that build on each other.

Sewing Divisions:

Best of Show from Classes 2631, 2632, 2633 combined (4H20/10)

2631. **Division I:** One of the following items to be made by the member - there should be no zippers or trim in the seams. 1. 9-patch pillow - opening **MUST** be slipstitched, 2. Square or Rectangular pillow - opening **MUST** be slipstitched, 3. Bag (tote or other) with only fabric or nylon handles.
2632. **Division II:** Garment should be constructed with self-casing for elastic or drawstring. The edge of the casing may be serged.
2633. **Division III:** Garment/outfit with fitted facing, interfacing and understitching. Choose a pattern that includes interfacing and understitching in the facing directions. Both are required and must be applied for this division.

Best of Show from Classes 2634, 2635, 2636 combined (4H20/10)

2634. **Division IV:** Garment/outfit with zipper
2635. **Division V:** Garment/outfit with sleeve and collar. The sleeve and collar should be separate pieces that are sewn in, **NOT** raglan sleeves or shawl collars.
2636. **Division VI:** Garment(s) of member's choice. Tailored garments included in this class.

Sewing With Knits (4H20/10)

It is recommended to choose a level comparable to sewing division exhibit.

2637. **Beginning:** Ages 8-10 Exhibit one garment constructed from knit fabric.

2638. **Intermediate:** Ages 11-13 Exhibit garment(s) constructed from knit fabric.

2639. **Advanced:** Ages 14+ Exhibit garment(s) constructed from knit fabric.

Non-Clothing (4H20/10)

Any non-wearable item hand or machine sewn by member. If pattern is used, **bring** both pattern and instructions for judging. Attach a 3x5 card stating: a) whether a pattern, kit, etc. was used, b.) what the item is and how it will be used, and c.) how many years the 4-Her has been enrolled in the class.

2640. **Beginning:** recommended for 1st year. Exhibit a simple project, original or from kit.

2641. **Intermediate:** recommended for 2nd to 4th year. Exhibit project from a set of instructions or commercial pattern.

2642. **Advanced:** recommended for 5th year and above. Exhibit project created from a set of instructions or commercial pattern.

2643. **New!!! Project Design:** all ages. Exhibit a project that is an original design. This may be a re-design or re-creation of multiple patterns or an entirely original creation.

Recycled Garment

2644. **Recycled Garment:** A modified/recycled garment you purchased in the past and salvaged by **significantly** altering the original design. Item displayed **must** be a garment. "Before" pictures are required.

2645. **New!!! Recycled Accessory:** Exhibit a project that is created from an accessory(s) that was purchased in the past. Examples of items that could be used: ties, bedspreads, curtains.

Clothing Displays (formerly Clothing Posters) (4H20/10)

Create a display or poster depicting an activity from the "Sewing and Textiles" or "Clothing Decisions" project books. The display can be no larger than 24" wide by 15" deep and poster no larger than 22"x 28". Include on the front of the poster or display the activity number used from the project book.

2646. **Beginning:** recommended for ages 8-12

2647. **Advanced:** recommended for ages 13 and over

Clothing Decisions (4H20/10)

Display purchased garment and a 22" x 28" poster depicting an activity from the "Clothing Decisions" project book. Hang tags, receipt and 4x6 photo should be **included on the front of the poster**. Please identify the activity number (from project book) on front of the poster. Garment will be judged **on the exhibitor with all accessories**.

2648. **Level 1:** recommended for grades 6-8

2649. **Level 2:** recommended for grades 9-12

Fashion Revue

****Jr. Revue: 2650**

****Sr. Revue: 2651**

All 4-Hers enrolling in sewing Divisions I-VI, Clothing Decisions, Sewing with Knits, and Recycled Garments will automatically be enrolled in the fashion revue. 4-Her may model and exhibit from only one class. Participation is optional. Participants must turn in emcee commentary, available online or at check-in.

1. All exhibitors **ages 8 to 12** as of September 1, 2008 are eligible to enter the Junior Revue beginning at 1 p.m., **Saturday, August 1** in the Cloverleaf Auditorium. Contestants must lineup beginning at 12:30 p.m. Revue begins at 1:00 p.m..
2. All exhibitors **13 and older** as of September 1, 2008 are eligible to enter the Senior Revue beginning at 4 p.m., **Saturday, August 1** in the Cloverleaf Auditorium. Contestants must be in place for lineup beginning at 3:30 p.m. Revue begins at 4:00 p.m..
3. 4-Hers may earn top model once in each revue. Thereafter, they are eligible to win second through tenth place.

****Based on current clothing enrollment and state fair rules, several exhibitors may be selected on poise, fashion, and overall appearance from the fashion revues to model at the State Fair.**

2661. Growing with Others I - Include the following three items that would be appropriate for a child of a specific age selected by the 4-Her.

1. A toy made by the 4-Her
2. A song or game
3. A story or story book that would be appropriate for a child of a specific age.

On a 3x5 card indicate the age of the child and how the items fit into the interests, abilities and safety considerations of that age child.

2662. Growing with Others II - Prepare a display of six to nine toys and/or activities (at least TWO must be made by 4-H member). Include two items for each of the following three age groups.

1. Infant/Toddler
2. Pre-School
3. School Age

For each toy and activity attach a 3x5 card indicating the age of the child and how that item fits into their interests, abilities, and safety considerations.

2663. Growing with Others III - Three-dimensional display illustrating one of the safety practices listed below. Include a 3x5 card indicating what audience this safety practice is targeted toward, how/where the 4-H member would use this display and where the information for the display was gathered. The display should be free standing and not exceeding 2' x 2' x 30" tall. You must bring all supplies to set up the display. Display will use no perishable foods, nor show brand names. Table space will be provided. Wall space will not be provided.
