NOTICE: ALL 4-H EXHIBITORS should read and understand the 4-H Rules and Regulations as printed in this fair book.

1. All cattle in the beef barn are to be under the supervision of the 4-H'er or a helper. The 4-H'er may forfeit all premiums and placements if an animal is left unattended in the barn for extended periods (Example: All Day). This decision will be made by a committee of Extension personnel and 4-H superintendents. All cattle stalled in the beef barn shall be tied out in designated areas each evening.
2. The Best 4-H Club Show class entry must meet the following criteria:
 - a. Three 4-H members from the same club or any number of exhibitors from 1 club over 3 members.
 - b. Animals must be exhibited by their owner.
 - c. A club may make more than one entry.
 - d. Club members may be from the same family.
3. 4-H member "Home Bred-Home Raised" heifer class. The 4-H'er must:
 - a. Be enrolled in the Beef Production unit of the project.
 - b. Have owned the dam at the time she was bred.
 - c. Birth date of heifer must be included on entry blank.
 - d. No pre-entry is required if the heifer is entered and shown in other beef classes.
 - e. Registration papers must be checked by Superintendent at check-in.
 - f. This class will show at the conclusion of the 4-H Heifer Show.
4. All cattle are to be fitted in the barns. All fitting should be completed by the 4-H'er and immediate family or with the assistance of another 4-H'er. Professional fitters are prohibited.
5. Health papers are required on all breeding cattle per state fair requirements.
6. Commercial Heifers and Cow/Calf pairs are eligible for Grand/Reserve Grand Champion Female over all breeds.
7. At the discretion of the superintendent, cattle will be disqualified from the show upon the 3rd escape from exhibitor.
8. All bedding must be straw and supplied by the exhibitor. The exhibitor is responsible for moving their bedding to outside the barn. Please take care to remove wire, twine or trash from bedding.

4-H Steer Show

NOTICE: ALL 4-H EXHIBITORS should read and understand the 4-H Rules and Regulations and Beef show rules as printed in this fair book.

1. Steers will be shown by breeds and broken in to weight classes following the weigh-in. Weigh-in is the same time as the Junior and Open show.
2. Steers must have been born after January 1 of the previous year. No steer can be shown – regardless of birth date – that does not have all of its milk teeth in place and no permanent teeth showing or evidence thereof.
3. All steers will be mouthed and tattoos checked at weigh-in time.
4. 4-H members may show any number of steers, but only 2 steers per class may collect premiums in the 4-H show.
5. No re-weighing will be allowed at the fair during the steer weigh-in.
6. Angus, Hereford, and Shorthorn Steers should gain 2.1 pounds per day; Simmental, Crossbred and All Other Breed Steers should gain 2.3 pounds per day between the County weigh-in and the weigh-in at the fair. For 2009 Angus, Hereford, and Shorthorn Steers should gain 319.2 pounds. Simmental, Crossbred, and All Other Breed Steers should gain 349.6 pounds.
7. An award will be given to the 4-H member whose steer has the highest average daily gain (ADG) between tattooing date and fair weigh-in.
8. Steers are expected to meet Average Daily Gain. However, no 4-H'er will be prohibited from showing a steer for not meeting ADG. Steers must be within 5% of ADG weight to exhibit for best of breed or grand champion awards. Example, a steer that should weigh 1200 lbs at fair time to meet ADG requirements would need to weigh a minimum of 1140 lbs to compete for best of breed or grand champion awards.
9. Health certificates are not required for steers.
10. 4-H member "Home Bred-Home Raised" steer class. The 4-H'er must:
 - a. Be enrolled in the Beef Production unit of the project.
 - b. Have owned the dam at the time she was bred.
 - c. Birth date of steer must be included on entry blank.
 - d. No pre -entry is required if the steer is entered and shown in other beef classes.
 - e. Registration papers, when applicable, must be checked by Superintendent at check-in.
 - f. This class will show at the conclusion of the 4-H Steer Show.
11. All bedding must be straw and supplied by the exhibitor. The exhibitor is responsible for moving their bedding to outside the barn. Please take care to remove wire, twine or trash from bedding.
