County Projects Rules and Regulations

1. In order to exhibit in county projects the 4-H member must be enrolled in that project.
2. See General project guidelines.
3. These are county only projects: There are no manuals, no premiums will be awarded, and none will be chosen for State Fair.

Class 01 -Stamp Collecting (Beginner)

Exhibit at least 75 stamps. Be able to discuss the stamps with the judge.

Class 02 – Stamp Collecting (Advanced)

Exhibit at least 150 stamps. Be able to discuss the stamps with the judge.

Class 03 – General Collections

Exhibit your collection in an appropriate manner. Submit a one page written report on how you became involved with collecting, and describe some of your favorite pieces..

Class 04 – Models (Beginner)

Exhibit a snap together type model

Class 05 – Models (Advanced)

Exhibit a glue together type model.

Class 06 –Cake Decorating

Class 07 – Candy Making

09 – Scrapbooking

Exhibit a page or scrapbook that you have made. Be prepared to discuss the book or page with the judge. This project will not be labeled DO NOT TOUCH.

10- Taxidermy

Exhibit one example of your work, either a pelt or a completely preserved piece.

11-Beekeeping

Exhibit a display (no live bees are allowed) on hives, management, or another area of beekeeping.

12 – Raising earthworms and worm composting

Exhibit a poster explaining the process of worm composting, worm habits, or some other variation of what you learned from this project.

13-Reading

Exhibit a written log and/or report of the printed material read. The member should be prepared to discuss why he/she chose the particular material. Printed materials may include magazines, books, or newspapers.

14- Party Planning

Exhibit a written or typed explanation of the type and/or theme of the party. (example: 6 year old girl with a princess theme) Exhibit may also include a display of the items needed to plan the party. This could include invitations, place settings, decorations, etc. The member should include a timeline of the party planning schedule.

15- Recycling

Exhibit a poster project on an activity or project that you worked on or chaired.
